Today, 100 years later, the Bridge Street bridge has a sufficiency rating of 12.8 (out of 50) and is restricted to 3 ton loading which is the lowest rating prior to bridge closure!

The resolution of this improvement project is under study and community meetings were held in January and February. The next meeting is scheduled for April.

The South County Historical Society is one of the members of the "Stakeholders" committee established to determine the resolution. Currently there are 5 alternatives proposed by the consulting group, Wallace Group of San Luis Obispo..

As members of the South County Historical Society, the Board would like you to express your choice and/or suggestions for the resolution.

- Option 1: Conventional Replacement: Construct an entirely new bridge, wider with bike lane, sidewalks. (Fully funded by Caltrans.)
- Option 2: Salvage and Relocate Trusses (original upper structure) on new concrete structure. Retain the upper historic structure placed on a new bridge, wider with bike lanes, sidewalks. (Fully funded by Caltrans.)
- **Option 3:** Replace in Kind. (funding by Caltrans doubtful).
- Option 4: Retrofit the existing structure. (funding by Caltrans doubtful).
- **Option 5:** Do nothing. (the bridge will be closed to vehicular traffic.
- **Option 6:** No opinion
